
Criteria for excluding a child from a daycare or a school

Excluding the child from the daycare.

His return will be permitted when **all** of the following conditions apply. :

- <u>Absence of fever</u>* for 24 hours without taking antipyretic (e.g. Tylenol, Tempra, Advil, Motrin)
- <u>The general condition of the child</u> allows them to follow the group's activities and requires little or no additional care (the educator can provide care without compromising the well-being of other children)
- <u>No vomiting</u> for 24 hours
- <u>If diarrhea episode</u>: Stool may be contained in the diaper or the child is continent, absence of blood in the stool
- If skin lesions with purulent discharge are present : Lack of discharge, crusted lesions or possibility of covering them with a waterproof dressing
- If excluded following a diagnosis or medical consultation : Physician's agreement to return to the daycare
- Other return criteria specific to diagnosis are met, if applicable

It is not necessary to exclude the child. Monitor their health and consult as needed.
